

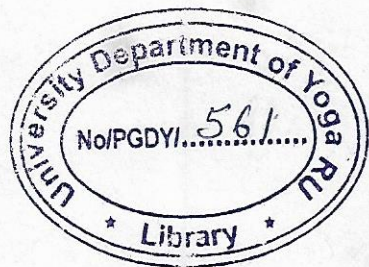

The work appears in five volumes. Vol. I comprises Buddhist and Jaina Philosophy and the six systems of Hindu thought, viz., Sāṃkhya, Yoga, Nyāya, Vaiśeṣika, Mimāṃsā and Vedānta. Vol. II provided complete studies in the Śāṅkara School of Vedānta. It also contains the philosophy of the Yogavāsiṣṭha, the Bhagavadgītā and speculations in the medical schools. Vol. III contains an elaborate account of the principal dualistic and pluralistic systems such as the philosophy of the Pāñcarātra, Bhāskara, Yāmuna, Rāmānuja, Nimbarka, Vijñānanabhikṣu and philosophical speculations of some of the selected Purāṇas. Vol. IV deals with the Bhāgavata Purāṇa, Madhva and his School, Vallabha, Caitanya, Jiva Gosvāmī and Baladeva Vidyābhūṣaṇa. Vol. V treats the southern schools of Śāivism, viz., Śāiva Siddhānta, Vīra Śāivism, philosophy of Śrīkaṅṭha, Śāiva Philosophy in the Purāṇas and in some important texts.
